**CONNECT** (5-10 minutes): Help the members of the group grow in relationships with one another so all people in the group know they matter. Spend some time discovering what is happening in the lives of your group members. Share how God has been revealing himself in each other's lives.

**REVIEW** (15-20 minutes): Use this time to review the passage and the sermon outline (see below).

Note: this is a great opportunity to share leadership.

Use these simple questions to review the sermon/passage or for if you don't have much time:

1. What does this passage teach you about God? About us?
2. How does this passage point us to the gospel? How does it challenge you? Change you?

**SCRIPTURE:**

*2 Timothy*

**SERMON OUTLINE:**

- I. Successful Disciple Making is bathed in prayer
- II. Successful Disciple Making is self-propagating
- III. Successful Disciple Making is rooted in the word of God
- IV. Successful Disciple Making points to Jesus

**GROW** (45-60 minutes): Use this time to go deeper with your group.

Use these questions to discuss the sermon/passage:

1. Think about disciple-making for a minute. In what ways are you involved in disciple-making? What formal or informal discipleship have you been a part of?
2. Read 2 Timothy 1:3-8. There is no profitable disciple-making without prayer. Where do we see the importance of prayer in this passage? What are some specific things you could be praying for in relationship to your disciple-making?
3. Read 2 Timothy 2:1-3. Where do we see the multiplication of disciples in this passage? Is there a desire (Joe called it a fire) in you to multiply yourself? Why or why not? What might fan that spark into flame?
4. Read 2 Timothy 3:14-4:2. Where do we see the importance of scripture for disciple-making in this passage? Is sharing/discussing/teaching scripture with others a regular part of your life? If not how might it be?
5. Read 2 Timothy 4:6-8. How does disciple-making connect to what Paul says in verses 7-8? Do you love the appearing of Christ? If so how might that motivate you in your disciple-making?

Pray: Thank God for those that have disciple you. Ask God to show you ways that you could be involved in disciple-making with others.
