

Notes from Today's Lesson:

Facing Our Fears: Fear of Trusting

1. We are all faced with the choice of who we are going to trust: ourself or our loving, heavenly Father.
 2. Isaiah 53:3 — Jesus came to deliver His people, but instead of trusting Him they mocked and rejected Him.
 3. Romans 5:12; 6:23 — We all have sinned and deserve to be punished.
 4. Isaiah 53:4-6 — The sins of the world, yours and mine, were placed on Jesus at the cross.
 5. Acts 16:31; Romans 5:1 — Those who trust in Jesus as Savior and Lord are forgiven and have peace with God.
 6. Psalm 46:1-7 — We should trust our all powerful and loving God will be with us through every storm of life.
- God's Plan for Forgiveness.
 - * God's plan for forgiveness requires us to trust in the saving work of Jesus to pay for our sins and make us right with God.
 - Chose to trust God with Every Decision.
 - * Trust God with your eternity.
 - * Trust God with your life in this world.
 - People will make fun of you and cause you suffering.
 - Realize they are sinful just like you and in need of a Savior.
 - Trust God and follow His plan of loving them and sharing His Good News.
 - Be comforted that nothing can separate you from God. Trust God will be with you for every moment of your life and will one day bring you to His eternal home in heaven.
