Notes from Today's Lesson: God Pursues You

- 1. Luke 15:1-2 God pursues people and those who know they need Him are drawn to Him.
- 2. Luke 15:3-4 Jesus tells 3 stories, and the first is about the commitment of a good shepherd to search for even one lost sheep.
- 3. Luke 15:5-7 Just as the friends and family of the shepherd will rejoice over finding the one lost sheep, all the angels of heaven will rejoice with God over the salvation of one lost child of God.
- 4. Luke 15:8-10 A woman searches for her one lost coin, finds it, and rejoices with her friends. This is another example of how all of heaven will rejoice over people who were lost and are now found.
- 5. Luke 15:11-12 This final story is about two sons, one who demands his inheritance from his father and one who stays home.
- 6. Luke 15:13-19 We need to realize the foolishness of our selfish living, and desire to return to our Heavenly Father.
- Luke 15:20-24 Like the father in Jesus' story, God the Father loves you, pursues
 you, and will celebrate when you are saved from you sin and are a part of the family of God.
- 8. Luke 15:25-31 God pursues even those who do not realize they need Him.

- Do you believe God is pursuing you? Why or why not?
