

**Notes from Today's Lesson:**

**Trust, Not Test**

1. Luke 20:19-20 — There were some who did not trust Jesus and kept putting Him to the test.
  2. Luke 20:21-22 — Some try to trap Jesus into saying people should not pay taxes to the government.
  3. Luke 20:23-24 — Jesus turns their question around and asked them whose picture was on the money.
  4. Luke 20:25 — Give to the government the things the government made, but give to God what is God's.
  5. Luke 20:26 — Those who did not like Jesus were amazed at His wisdom, but did not change their hearts.
  6. Ephesians 2:8-10 — We are God's treasure, created and saved for His honor and glory, to be used for His purposes.
