

**Sermon:** Stir Up One Another.  
**Series:** *One Another.*

**Scripture:** Hebrews 10:19-25.  
**Date:** August 28, 2022

**OBSERVATION** -- As a group, talk through and summarize the passage. Think through *Who, What, Where, When, How, Why* questions together.

**INTERPRETATION** -- Answer these questions together:

**1. What does this passage teach us about God?**

a) Read Jeremiah 32:38. God wants to be our God and he wants us to be his people. How does Hebrews 10:19-25 demonstrate the fulfillment of this?

**2. What does this passage teach us about us?**

a) In what ways have you (or do you) made a habit of neglecting the assembling of the church?

b) Verse 22 tells us that we should draw near in full assurance of faith. In the sermon we listed five things we can have faith in when we gather: 1) Faith in our identity as priests in Christ, 2) Faith in God's faithfulness, 3) Faith that knowing and being known is a good thing, 4) Faith in our future gathering in Heaven (Heb. 12:22-24), 5) Faith that we will experience Christ in a unique way at the gathering (Heb. 2:11-12).

Which of these stand out to you? Inspires you as you gather?

**3. What does this passage teach us about grace/salvation? How does it point to Christ?**

a) Re-read verses 19-21. What do these verses teach us about the work of Christ on our behalf? What is his past work? What is his ongoing work?

b) How do you draw near to God? On what basis do you enter into his presence? What keeps you sanctified before God? How would you answer these questions?

c) Why must our love and good works be the result of our cleansing, not the cause of our cleansing?

**APPLICATION**

a) How can we consider one another (look intently, pay attention to) in this small group? How might we stir up one another to love and good works? Are these two things happening in this group? Why or why not?

**FIGHTER VERSES: Philippians 2:5-8.**

**PRAYER**

- Thank God that he has never given up on us.
- Confess ways that you neglected the gathering of the church or failed to stir up one another.
- Thank Jesus for his work of salvation by his blood.
- Ask God to help you to stir up one another to love and good works by grace through faith alone.
