

**Sermon: Trust and Obey Our Promise keeping God.**  
**Series: Exodus: From Slavery to Glory.**

**Scripture: Exodus 6:1-7:13.**

**OBSERVATION** -- As a group, talk through and summarize the passage. Think through *Who, What, Where, When, How, Why* questions together.

**INTERPRETATION** -- Answer these questions together:

**1. What does this passage teach us about us?**

a) In Exodus 6, Moses continues to doubt God's calling. Is there anywhere that you continue to doubt God's calling in your life to make disciples, love others, or serve?

**2. What does this passage teach us about God?**

a) Remember, Exodus 5 ended with Moses complaining to God. How does God respond to Moses at the beginning of chapter 6? Why do you think God simply repeats what he has already told Moses?

b) How does this passage demonstrate the sovereign power of God? How does this chapter encourage you to trust God's control over your life? Is there somewhere in your life that you need to stop trying to control instead of trusting God?

**3. What does this passage teach us about grace/salvation? How does it point to Christ?**

a) Look at 6:6-8. God says "I will" seven times. How do these seven promises to Israel point ahead to Christ as the fulfillment of all God's promises to us?

b) God never asks us to obey a command that he does not graciously empower us to obey. How did God empower Moses and Aaron (7:8-13)? How does he empower us to obey?

**APPLICATION**

a) What promise of God do you need to trust this week?

b) Despite all his doubts and fears, Moses fully obeys God (7:6;10). Is there something that God has commanded us to do that you need to obey

**PRAYER**

- Thank God that he is in control of every circumstance in your life.
- Confess ways that you have continued to doubt God's power and goodness.
- Thank Jesus for being the fulfillment of all God's promises.
