Sermon: Why Then the Law? Scripture: Exodus 20:12-26.

Series: Exodus: From Slavery to Glory. Date: March 12, 2023

OBSERVATION -- As a group, talk through and summarize the passage. Think through *Who, What, Where, When, How, Why* questions together.

INTERPRETATION -- Answer these questions together:

1. What does this passage teach us about God?

a) Think through the three main sections of this text (20:12-17; 18-21; 22-26). What does each one reveal about God?

2. What does this passage teach us about us?

- a) What has been your relationship/attitude toward the Ten Commandments in the past? Have you tried to obey them? Have you ignored them?
- b) How do each of the commandments 5-10 reveal the dignity, equality, and image of God in man? How do they each reveal the sinfulness of man?

3. What does this passage teach us about grace/salvation? How does it point to Christ?

- a) What pictures or images of Christ do you see in this passage? How specifically can you see them pointing to Jesus?
- b) Read Romans 6:15-19. Paul says that we are obedient from the heart. Why could the Ten Commandments NOT change our hearts? What does Paul say actually frees our hearts from sin?
- c) Read John 13:34. What is Christ's New Covenant Law for us? How is it similar to the law at Sinai? How is it different? (Hint: think about how union with Christ internalizes the law).

APPLICATION

- a) Re-read verse 20. Moses contrasts being afraid of God with fearing God. Would you say that your life demonstrates being afraid of God or a proper fear of God (or maybe neither)? What might need to change in your beliefs for you to have a proper fear of God?
- b) How would you explain the role of the Ten Commandments in a Christian's life? Use Romans 13:8-10 to help you.

FIGHTER VERSES: Romans 13:8-10.

PRAYER

- Praise God for his holy law of love.
- Confess ways that you have failed to fear God.
- Thank Jesus for being your final altar of sacrifice for sin.
- Ask God to help you honor the image of God in others by loving them.
