Sermon: Salt and Light. Scripture: Matthew 5:13-16.

Series: Gathering and Scattering Date: June 30, 2024

OBSERVATION -- As a group, talk through and summarize the passage. Think through *Who, What, Where, When, How, Why* questions together.

INTERPRETATION -- Answer these questions together:

1. What does this passage teach us about us?

- a) What does Jesus' call for us to be "salt and light" tell us about the world we live in?
- b) Salt is a change agent, it makes things different. Do you believe that your presence is making a difference where you are? In what ways? Remember Jesus doesn't say "be salt." He says "you ARE salt." Does this change your answer to the question?
- c) Jesus warns about "losing our taste" (v.13). In what ways might you be losing your salty taste/zest? Remember this comes as salt is diluted.

2. What does this passage teach us about God?

a) Look closely at verse 16 again. What does it teach us about God and our relationship to him as our Father?

3. What does this passage teach us about grace/salvation? How does it point to Christ?

- a) Why is Jesus the only one who could fully exemplify this passage as salt, light, city, etc.?
- b) Can you explain this statement: "Good works are our fruit not our root."
- c) Why must we have Christ in us in order to live the way Jesus is calling us to in this passage?

APPLICATION

a) The "You" in this passage is plural, and in verse 15 Christ calls us a city on a hill, implying a plurality. Why do we need each other if we are going to live as salt and light? In what ways are you being a city on a hill alongside other church members? If you're not, how can you?

PRAYER

- Thank God for making us salt and light.
- Confess ways that you have lost your saltiness through dilution.
- Thank Jesus for being perfect salt and light for us so that we can be salt and light through him.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to help you to do the good works that glorify God.
